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Overview

Current Margins in the House

- House Republicans currently hold a 218-213 advantage with four vacant seats. 218 seats are needed to control the chamber. Every two years, all 435 seats in the House are up for election, as well as six non-voting delegates.
- The election will be held on November 5, 2024. The 119th Congress will begin with reelected and newly elected Members beginning two-year terms on January 3, 2025.
- As of today, 49 sitting Members have announced they will not be returning in the 119th Congress. Retirements or those running for other office have been announced by 22 Republicans and 24 Democrats, including four Republican committee chairs (Appropriations; Energy and Commerce; Financial Services; and Select China).
- Races to watch because they lean Democrat, lean Republican, or are toss-ups are coded in this document based on analysis from leading political pundits, including *270 To Win*, *Real Clear Politics*, *the Cook Political Report*, and *Sabato's Crystal Ball*.
- Closer to the elections, we will also begin tracking Members who may be looking to switch their committee assignments in the new Congress.
- As the margins in the House become clear after the election and we learn more about committee ratios, we plan to expand this document to reflect seats that parties may gain or lose on each committee, as well as current committee members who may be at risk of losing a seat due to changing committee ratios.

Special Elections

- Rep. Kevin McCarthy's (R-CA-20) resignation was effective as of December 31, 2023. A special primary took place on March 19. Republicans Vince Fong and Mike Bourdreaux have advanced. The general election to fill the remainder of the term will be held on May 21. Fong and Bourdreaux have also both advanced to the general election on November 5. This seat is expected to remain solidly-red.
- Rep. Bill Johnson (R-OH-6) resigned on January 21. A special primary took place on March 19. Michael Kripchak (D) and Michael Rulli (R) won the nomination for their respective parties. The general election to fill the remainder of the term will be held on June 11. Both Kripchark and Rulli as well as William Farms (I) are running in the general election on November 5. This seat is expected to remain solidly-red.
- Rep. Brian Higgins (R-NY-26) resigned on February 2. New York Gov. Kathy Hochul (D) has scheduled a special election on April 30. This seat is expected to remain solidly-blue.
- Rep. Ken Buck (R-CO-4) resigned on March 22. Colorado Gov. Jared Polis (D) has scheduled a special election for June 25. The seat is expected to remain red.

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- Rep. Mike Gallagher (R-WI-8) will resign on April 19. There will not be a special election for his seat as his resignation will happen within a window in Wisconsin law that dictates the seat be filled in the general election. The seat is expected to remain solidly-red.

Republican Leadership

- **Leadership: Speaker** Mike Johnson (R-LA) is seeking re-election and could keep his leadership role even if control of the House changes. He could face competition, especially if Republicans perform poorly in the general election. On March 22, Rep. Marjorie Taylor Green (R-GA) filed a motion to vacate, though she has not committed to forcing a vote on ousting the **Speaker** and at least for now, there is some thinking Democrats would rally to support **Speaker** Johnson if his speakership is challenged. **Majority Leader** Steve Scalise (R-LA) and **Majority Whip** Tom Emmer (R-MN) are also running for re-election and will likely maintain their positions regardless of the House's balance. **Chief Deputy Whip** Guy Reschenthaler (R-PA) might stay in his role. However, Rep. Michael Burgess (R-TX), who was tapped by Speaker Johnson in April to serve as **Rules** chair as former Chair Tom Cole (R-OK) took the **Appropriations** gavel, is retiring at the end of this Congress. Rep. Reschenthaler may have an opportunity to become the top Republican on **Rules**. This would leave the **Chief Deputy Whip** spot open.
- **House Republican Conference (HRC): HRC Chair** Elise Stefanik (R-NY) has been vying for a leadership role for several years, having previously vowed she would serve just one term as third-ranking Republican. There is some speculation that President Trump may be considering Rep. Stefanik as a running mate. If she remains in Congress, it is unclear if Rep. Stefanik will seek another term as HRC chair. If she becomes a top Republican on a standing committee, she will no longer be eligible to remain as HRC Chair unless a waiver is approved. **HRC Vice Chair** Blake Moore (R-UT) and **HRC Secretary** Lisa McClain (R-MI) have both announced they are running for re-election and could remain in their leadership roles.
- **Republican Policy Committee (RPC): RPC Chair** Gary Palmer (R-AL) has announced he is running for re-election and could serve another term as RPC chair. If he becomes a top Republican on a standing committee, he will no longer be eligible to remain as RPC chair unless a waiver is approved.
- **National Republican Congressional Committee (NRCC): NRCC Chair** Richard Hudson (R-NC) has announced he is running for re-election and could remain in his leadership role. If he becomes a top Republican on a standing committee, he will no longer be eligible to remain as RPC chair unless a waiver is approved.
- **Republican Study Committee (RSC): RSC Chair** Kevin Hern (R-OK) has announced he is running for re-election and could remain in his leadership role.
- **Elected Leadership Committee:** Under former Speaker Kevin McCarthy (R-CA), this committee was led by Rep. Garret Graves (R-LA). However, under Speaker Johnson, this position has been eliminated and the committee is run by the Speaker. If Speaker Johnson remains in his role next Congress, it could remain this way.

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Democratic Leadership

- **Leadership: Minority Leader** Hakeem Jeffries (D-NY) and **Minority Whip** Katherine Clark (D-MA) have all announced they are running for re-election and could remain in their leadership positions. **Assistant Leader** James Clyburn (D-SC) stepped down from his leadership role on February 15. **DPCC Chair** Joe Neguse (D-CO) was named as the new **Assistant Leader** on March 20. It is also worth noting that Rep. Clyburn's position was specifically created for him after he left his whip position, which created ambiguity around his rank in leadership. To resolve this, some Democrats are weighing internal rules change to clarify the leadership ranking.
- **Democratic Caucus: Chair** Pete Aguilar (D-CA) and **Vice Chair** Ted Lieu (D-CA) will both be eligible to continue in their current leadership roles as they have not hit the two consecutive term limit for caucus chair and vice chair, respectively.
- **Democratic Congressional Campaign Committee (DCCC):** It is likely premature to speculate who could succeed **DCCC Chair** Suzan DelBene (D-WA) though she could remain in her leadership role. Caucus rules state that the Speaker or Democratic leader must nominate a DCCC Chair no later than February 15 of the first session of a new Congress.
- **Democratic Policy and Communications Committee (DPCC):** **DPCC Chair** Joe Neguse (D-CO) was named the new **Assistant Leader** on March 20, which has created a vacancy for the chair spot. **DPCC Co-Chairs** Veronica Escobar (D-TX) and Lauren Underwood (D-IL) as well as Rep. Debbie Dingell (D-MI), a former co-chair, are all vying for the position. Rep. Lori Trahan (D-MA) has announced her intention to run for **DPCC Co-Chair**.
- **Leadership Representatives: Caucus Leadership Representative (CLR)** Sara Jacobs (D-CA) is eligible to continue in her leadership role under caucus rules. **Freshman Leadership Representative (FLR)** Jasmine Crockett (D-TX) will no longer be eligible to continue in her leadership role given she will no longer be a freshman. **Battleground Leadership Representative (BLR)** Abigail Spanberger (D-VA) will not seek re-election as she is running for governor in Virginia in 2025, meaning the BLR position will be vacant. Caucus rules state that the BLR must either be a DCCC Frontline Member returning from the recent election cycle, a new DCCC Red to Blue Member with the same status by Election Day, or a candidate who converts a Republican district to Democratic. Again, it is likely too early to speculate who is interested in this role.
- **Democratic Steering and Policy Committee:** Minority Leader Jeffries currently serves as **Steering and Policy Chair**. He will continue in this role if he remains Leader. **Co-Chair** Debbie Wasserman Schultz (D-FL) is eligible to continue in her leadership role, but would have to be re-elected. **Co-Chair** Dan Kildee (D-MI) is retiring, and **Co-Chair** Barbara Lee (D-CA) is running for the vacant Senate seat in California, meaning there will be at least two vacancies on the committee. It is likely too early to speculate who may be interested in running for these positions.

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General Rules Pertaining to Committee Leadership

- Both Republicans and Democrats have established party rules.
- **Full Committees:** Neither party is bound by seniority. Both parties tend to consider merit, length of service to committee, commitment, and diversity when making nominations.
- **Subcommittees:** Both parties tend to look to seniority on the full committee as the primary factor for selecting subcommittee chairs, though there are exceptions and other factors that are considered.
- Waivers and temporary committee assignments are permitted.
- Democrats and Republicans establish exclusivity and non-exclusivity for certain committees, with limitations.
- Exclusive Committees include Appropriations; Energy and Commerce; Financial Services; Rules; and Ways and Means.
- Generally, no Member is permitted to serve on more than one Exclusive Committee.
- Non-Exclusive Committees include Agriculture; Armed Services; Budget; Education and Labor; Foreign Affairs; Homeland Security; House Administration; Judiciary; Natural Resources; Oversight and Reform; Science, Space, and Technology; Small Business; Transportation and Infrastructure; and Veterans' Affairs.

Republican Caucus Rules on Committee Leadership

- **Term Limits:** A Republican Member can serve three consecutive terms as chair and ranking member. In other words, six years as chair or ranking member constitutes a term limit.
- **Exclusive Committees:** A Republican Member can chair one committee with exceptions. The six-year term limit applies. There are no restrictions on eligibility to serve as vice chair.
- **Non-Exclusive Committees:** A Republican Member can chair one committee with exceptions. The six-year term limit applies. There are no restrictions on eligibility to serve as vice chair.
- **Non-Standing Committees:** The six-year term limit applies to full committees and subcommittees.

Democratic Caucus Rules on Committee Leadership

- **Exclusive Committees:** A Democratic Member can chair one committee and is generally precluded from being chair of any subcommittee, though there are exceptions for the chair of Appropriations, Ethics, and House Administration. The chair of an exclusive committee cannot be a member of any other committee, except for the chairs of Agriculture, Budget, Foreign Affairs, House Administration, Natural Resources, Oversight and Reform, Science, Space and Technology, Small Business, and Veterans' Affairs. Vice chairs of exclusive committees must be Members who have served less than five terms. A vice chair can only serve for one term.
- **Non-Exclusive Committees:** A Democratic Member can chair one committee and is generally precluded from being chair of any subcommittee, with exceptions. A Member who chairs a non-

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exclusive Committee can serve on a maximum of two committees. Vice chairs of non-exclusive committees must be Members who have served less than five terms. A vice chair can only serve for one term.

- **Membership:** Members of an exclusive committee cannot serve on any other exclusive or non-exclusive committee, with exceptions for Budget and House Administration. A Member cannot serve on more than two committees with legislative jurisdiction, except for House Administration and Ethics.
- If a committee chair nominee who was chair in the previous Congress and remains eligible is re-elected, generally no other nominations are permitted and the caucus votes by secret ballot on the sole nominee.
- **Subcommittees:** No Member can serve as chair of more than one subcommittee, except for House Administration, Ethics, and joint committees.

Outlook: 118th Congress **Agriculture** Chair Glenn Thompson (R-PA) will likely remain as the committee's top Republican. Ranking Member David Scott (D-GA), who has led Committee Democrats since the 116th Congress, could move on from the top role. If this happens, Rep. Jim

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Costa (D-CA) might be interested in becoming the top Democrat on the committee, as he ran against Rep. Scott for the top spot in past years and would be among those next in line to take over.

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Outlook: 118th Congress **Appropriations** Chair Kay Granger (R-TX) is retiring at the end of this Congress, and on March 22, announced she would be handing off the gavel early. Rep. Tom Cole (R-OK) was elected to lead the committee on April 9 and is expected to remain the top Republican on the committee in the 119th Congress. 118th Congress Ranking Member Rosa DeLauro (D-CT) will likely remain in her leadership role.

Appropriations is considered an Exclusive Committee meaning Members assigned to this committee generally do not receive any other assignments. According to Caucus rules, Democratic Members on **Appropriations** are automatically renominated. There is no equivalent rule for the Republican Conference.

Outlook: 118th Congress **Budget** Chair Jodey Arrington (R-TX) and Ranking Member Brendan Boyle (D-PA) will likely remain as the committee’s leadership in the 119th Congress.

House rules dictate the composition of the **Budget** Committee, requiring five Members from **Appropriations**, five Members from **Ways and Means**, one Member from **Rules**, and one Member chosen by each party’s leadership. The Republican Speaker appoints the second highest-ranking Republican on the committee. In the case of Democrats, when they are the majority, three Members must come from **Appropriations**, three from **Ways and Means**, and at least one from **Rules**. In the minority, Democrats must have two Members from **Appropriations** and two from **Ways and Means**. The top Democrat on the **Budget** Committee is elected by the Democratic Caucus, while the top Republican is nominated by the Republican Steering Committee.

Ranking Member Wild's race has been rated as a toss-up. Should she lose re-election, it is unclear as of now who may be interested in the top Democratic spot.
